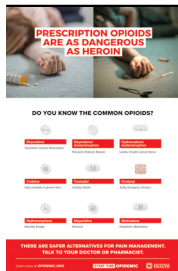

You are at high risk for an opioid overdose if you:

Naloxone resources

You can prevent death from an opioid overdose

You are at high risk for an opioid overdose if you:

- Are taking high doses of opioids for long term management of chronic pain
- Have a history of substance abuse or previous non-fatal overdose
- Have received opioid treatment as a result of completing a detoxification program or were recently released from incarceration
- Are using a combination of opioids and other drugs such as alcohol and benzodiazepines (Xanax, Valium, Klonopin)
- Are unfamiliar with the strength and dosage of prescription opioids and the purity of street drugs like heroin
- Have taken other drugs such as
- Cocaine
- Quinine
- Antibiotics
- Antidepressants
- Antipsychotics
- Sedatives
- Muscle relaxants
- Anesthetics
- Heroin
- MARIJUANA
- Have been off opioids for 12 hours and resume taking them

Naloxone Resources

Utah Naloxone Laws

- Individuals can report an overdose without fear of criminal prosecution for illegal possession of a controlled substance or Block Drug Good Samaritan Law SB00000113
- Naloxone can be prescribed and dispensed to third parties (family or regular health or clergy member of a person at risk for an opioid overdose) (Naloxone Access Law SB00000116)
- Pharmacists can dispense naloxone through the use of a standing order issued by a physician (Naloxone Standing Order SB00000118)

You can prevent death from an opioid overdose

Recognize Overdose Warning Signs:

- Very slow body and very pale face
- Slow or no breathing
- No response when you yell his name or rub hard on the middle of the chest (Jugum test)
- Slow breathing that starts (about every 5 seconds) or no breathing
- Holding their tongue out or gagging, turning blue
- Small pupils that do not respond to light

If you see or hear any one of these behaviors, call 9-1-1 or get medical help immediately!
